President's Message

ESSFN Newsletter, Number 3 December 2005

Our society has the privilege to serve as the chapter of the European Association of Neurosurgical Societies (EANS) responsible for stereotactic and functional neurosurgery. The EANS likewise works as the chapter of neurosurgery within the Union Europeanne des Medicines Specialistes (UEMS). Within this European field of medical policies, the ESSFN now has the unique chance to play a leading role for our subspecialty. Therefore, we have asked our national representatives (the members of the Executive Committee) to help us strengthen the interactions between individuals, countries and the European Society. A letter concerning this issue has been sent out by our second secretary Jean-Guy Villemure in March, 2005. While 13 members responded, 7 did not. Those who replied appreciated this idea as a positive and important new concept, and some eventually wished to organize national chapters of our society.

On October 1, 2005, the club Francais had its annual meeting in Marseilles and our French colleagues expressed the wish to form the first official national chapter of the ESSFN. I had the pleasure and honour as president of the ESSFN to address the French national chapter there at its inauguration!

Many other and new subspecialties arise in general neurosurgery, such as: pediatric, neurovascular, spinal et cetera. However, stereotactic and functional neurosurgery has been from its beginning (remember the first ESSFN Congress in 1970) a distinct subspecialty, although not (yet) with a professional and legal certification. It is to be expected, that in the long run throughout Europe more and more documents and certificates are required for official qualification in the field of neurosurgery! The ESSFN here once more has a leading role and responsibility: to create networks and to offer scholarships, fellowships, hands-on courses, and meetings which will be recognized through accreditation by CME credit points.

Our second Hands-on Course in Toulouse, September 15-16, 2005, on Surgical Management of Pain had 12 such CME credits. More than 30 young colleagues who attended this course have received their official certificates. The first course on Surgery for Movement Disorders was held in Tolochenaz in 2003. Both were made possible by Medtronic with an Educational Grant to our society. The ESSFN officers have decided to make these two basic courses available at regular intervals with accreditation and certification for our young trainees who want to specialize further in the stereotactic and functional neurosurgical fields.



In the coming period we have to think about the definition of our subspecialty: what makes you a stereotactic and functional neurosurgeon, what are the prerequisites for it and so on. At least, training in a centre that has specific interest in this field plus a fellowship of 6 to 12 months extra after specialization seem to be required.

I hope, that the Montreux Meeting of our Society will give ample opportunity to discuss these matters in more detail!

For the year 2005, the payments included the costs for the new website, advance payment for the Montreux 2006 Congress (to be paid back later) and the 2004 Research Grant.


The financial balance autorizes us to increase the 2006 Research Grant amount to 20.000 □ !!!

Report on the Hands-on Course in Toulouse, France, September, 2005

The 2nd ESSFN Hands-On Course was held at the Faculty of Medicin of the University of Toulouse (September 15-16, 2005) on the topic **Surgical Management of Pain.**

The Scientific Program included:

- 1) Plenary sessions with lectures on: Pathophysiology of chronic pain: from basic science to treatment (D. Bouhassira); Consensus conferences on the neurosurgical treatment of pain (Y. Lazorthes); Principles and classification of surgical procedures (G. Broggi); Anatomical basis and surgical techniques of DREZ-otomy (M. Sindou); and Mechanisms of action of electrical stimulation for pain control (S. Blond).
- 2) Hands-On Workshops (3 groups Laboratory of Anatomy Practical exercises on human cadavers) on differents topics: Percutaneous ablative techniques (cervical cordotomy, Gasserian neurotomy, facet denervation, coeliac block, ...), Open ablative and other open techniques (cervical DREZ-otomy, cerebellopontine angle approach, microvascular decompression, ...), Neurostimulation (epidural spinal cord, deep brain, motor cortex) and Application of intrathecal drugs with implantable devices.
- 3) Round Table Discussions with presentations of clinical cases: surgical strategy for essential trigeminal neuralgia and surgical management of severe neuropathic pain.

The selected participants were 32 young neurosurgeons: 30 from European countries (17 different nations), and two non-European neurosurgeons (from Mexico and from Brazil).

The European Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education (EACCME), an institution of the UEMS (European Union of Medical Specialists) has granted 12 European CME credits for this course.

The evaluation of the course by the participants (general assessment, course organisation, plenary sessions, workshops, round tables, etc) was considered as excellent. The course was sponsored by Medtronic Europe.

- The research project must address an original topic relevant to the field of Stereotactic and Functional Neurosurgery
- The applicant must be a member of the ESSFN.
 There is no age limit.
- Selection will be finalized by the Officers before October 30, 2006.
- Conclusions of the selected project must be reported in September 2008, and presented during the 2008 ESSFN Congress.

FUNDING

THE RESEARCH GRANT AMOUNT IS: 20,000 Euros

Financing of the project will be progressive, and will be distributed in 3 parts:

November 2006 (selection) 10.000 € During 2007 (on written proofs) 5.000 € At the conclusion of the report 5.000 €
